In Vietnamese culture, death is also a form of rebirth. When a person dies, the family and community enact rituals that will enable the deceased to pass into another realm, a higher state of being.

Under This Weight (20 mins) *Under This Weight* is part of Dam Van Huynh's "Nude Series" in which he explores the many facets of the nude self: the physical form and the fragile self, stripped of inhibitions.

The duet exposes human reactions when under pressure through expressionistic gestures and emotional form, be it a mental or physical pressure: endurance, resistance, surrender. There is no winner in this exchange, but a constant power shift between equal forces.
